


Lobbyist's Legislative Report

The Legislature finally passed some Budget cuts - roughly \$12,500,000,000 with another \$12.5 billion to be slashed or they will need to pass the sales, income, and cartax extensions! Negotiations are still on to pass some sort of public workers' pension reform and give businesses some relief from excessive government environmental rules!

Sheep in Wolves Clothing aka Young Drivers and Riders by John Del Santo

They look big enough to be adults, they seem like they're old enough to be responsible, and they are coming down the lane right next to your motorcycle. While only 4% of the cars around you are driven by young people, they are at fault in 66% of the deadly collisions. We cannot assume that any of the drivers around us will make the correct driving decisions at any given time, but there are ways we can try to improve those statistics.

This is also an important decision time for you if there are children in your family who are reaching that driving or riding age. As the new-driver laws stand at the moment, www.dmv.ca.gov, someone age 15 1/2 to age 17 1/2 must first finish a Drivers Education Class before they can apply for a learner's permit. Once they

pass the DMV written test and obtain a permit, the permit does not become legal until they have taken at least one lesson with a State Licensed Driving Instructor. I have seen the reason for this in my many years as a driving instructor when a new student gets "practice" with Dad or an older motorcycle riders. It is called "Jarrad's brother first, and then starts the six-hours of mandatory training with a professional licensed instructor. The instructor has to waste valuable training time trying to correct improper techniques and misinformation already fed to the student.

Many teenagers start off wrong if Dad or Mom are not safe and legal drivers. If Dad speeds and Mom tailgates and doesn't use her signals, how do you think the new driver is going to start his or her career on the road? Any teenager has been learning how to drive for twelve or thirteen years, just by watching - you are setting an

example for them every day of their lives. Do it right and their lives may be longer. Cellular/Text phones are Weapons of Mass Destruction and should be locked in the trunk.

There is a new law for young Law", named after a deceased teenager who had a learner's permit, but no proper training. Fixing the loophole in response, Jarrad's Law took effect in California on January 1, 2011. Now anyone from age 15 1/2 to age 21 who wants to obtain a motorcycle license must first complete a 15-hour safety course overseen by the California Highway Patrol's California Motorcyclist Safety Program (CMSP), www.ca-msp.org . From age 15 and 1/2 to age 18, they must also either have a class C license or complete regular driver's education and training classes. After the

motorcycle safety course, they must pass a written test to receive a permit. The learner's permit must be held at least six months to become eligible for an actual motorcycle license. While operating a motorcycle with a permit, a rider may not carry a passenger, ride on a freeway, or ride at night. Have you read the drivers manual that the DMV gave to your son or daughter? Knowledge is power.

Those of us with young drivers or riders in the family should try to put them out there with a better chance of getting to be old drivers and riders.






















STAYING BETWEEN THE LINES

One of the first projects assigned to children in Kindergarten is when they are supplied with a coloring book and a box of crayons, and are taught to color nice and be careful and stay between the lines. With many of them, somewhere between that time and the time they learn to drive, something bad happens to that portion of their brain, and they drive down the road floating around like a boat in the bay, totally unable to keep a six-foot wide car in between a set of twelve-foot wide lane lines ...and we're sharing the road with them!

You see them all the time around you...the ones who are probably not reading the highway road signs, staying out in the left lanes until they are eleven feet from the exit they wanted, and then making a dive for the exit or their counterparts who are already on the exit ramp when they decide they really didn't want to get off here, and they make a radical swerve back out onto the highway...without checking their blind-spots...And DON'T expect a directional signal from these folks! Some of these "special" drivers start





out in one part of a double-left-turn lane, and finish in the other lane whether or not there is another car or motorcycle already occupying that space. Very often they're unaware of any other vehicle near them. They'll stop at a traffic signal in a 'Turn-Only' lane, and when the light turns green they go straight through the intersection. Sure... if you or I missed a street or an exit, we would just go to the next exit and get off and go back...but so many of these drivers seem like they would take a chance crashing their car into the vehicles around them, or up against the exit-divider, rather than miss their turn. That area around the exit-divider

why they call it that. Most people who drive mirror... Now they're getting like this, driving as if they have a paper bag ready to move. Be ready! over their head, don't maintain enough following distance, either. So when something unexpected happens, they brake hard and swerve out of their lane...usually towards the right side. When you are approaching them on a residential street, streets without a painted center-line, don't expect them to figure out where their half take sips from their Cappuccino, of the street is.

We need to be aware when we are in anvone's Blind Area, or when they are in ours, and adjust our space so that we are not in the target area of their poor driving. We can read the 'body language' of their intentions most of the time, and figure out what they are probably going to do before they do it. Don't trust the 'tailgaters' ... They'll change lanes fast and use no directional signals. When driving around those big, wide, tall S.A.V.'s (Suburban Assault Vehicles), be aware that they have a lot more blind areas than smaller cars, and be ready to move somewhere else. When you can't see a drivers face in any mirror, they can't see you. Be ready to use your horn if they start to move across the line, to let them know that you are near them, but don't be surprised if they can't hear your horn or pipes over the stereo. When they are just thinking about moving, they will unconsciously drift their car towards that side of the lane. Watch for them glancing at the rearview

Gee Whiz! The poor things are driving at a disadvantage, Ya know... It hardly seems fair for us to expect them to steer, dial the car-phone, read a text-message, use directional signals, and stay between the lines all at the same time, when they only have two hands! But as long as we are riding near them, sharing the road with them, we should expect the worst from them and do the best we can to avoid becoming a target. Be Aware, and....Ride Safe!!





Time Keeps on Passing

by John Del Santo

When we decide that the car in front of us on that two-lane road is going slower than we want to go, we have several observations and decisions to make that can result in a number of different outcomes. Such as making a successful pass, being passive until a nice space comes along, lying in a hospital bed with life passing us by, or maybe even passing awav.

A poorly done pass can result in a headon collision which is the most deadly type of collision we can be involved in. At only 50 MPH, two vehicles approaching each other are closing the gap at 150 feet per second! When we decide to pass, IF the other cars don't speed up, and IF the slower car is aware that we are starting to pass, and IF no one pulls out of a driveway down the road, and IF we haven't misjudged anyone's speed or distance, then it will still take us about a quarter of a mile to make a safe, clean, pass. If I don't have driver's part to transform the tailgating motorcycle

that much room, or if I can't see at least that far down the road, then I don't start the pass! Another opportunity will come along in a minute. If the approaching car appears to be standing still, then that car is at least a quarter-mile away from me. If the car looks like it is moving towards me, if I can see motion, then it's closer than a quarter of a mile, and it's probably too close to complete a safe pass!

Not everyone uses their signals for one reason or another. That car in front of you that is going slow, or slowing down, may be preparing for a left turn. Surprise! Surprise! Most of them don't use their mirrors except for shaving and combing their hair, and they don't even know that you're back

While waiting for a good spot to make a pass, some riders move in close and tailgate the slower driver to demonstrate their impatience. This action gains nothing, doesn't leave much room to accelerate into a passing run, and limits their visibility of what's happening up the road. It would also take only a small, sudden mistake on the car

into a big dent on the back of the slow guy's car and then the whole purpose of the trip would become passé.

While it is against the law to pass over solid-yellow centerlines, the main reason we shouldn't consider passing over them is that they are pretty good indicators that we don't have enough space or visibility to make a pass, or that the possibility for interference from cross-traffic is high.

If we do it right, then our pass will have become past history, and we will have done it with a passing grade. Ride Safe!


What You See is What You Get

Your ride is only as safe as your visibility, and a good pair of glasses can make your day. Not all states require wearing glasses when we ride, but a stinging rain or meeting a big fat bug at 60 mph can suggest that riding without eye protection is not a great idea. Using an anti-fog solution on your glasses or goggles can be a big help on bad weather days, but some chemicals can damage prescription glasses, so check the label on the chemical or call the 800 number shown on the package to ask and check it out. Keeping your eyewear or face-shield clean is important. Paper towels can be more abrasive than cotton cloth and can cause scratching in the long run.

Blue Blocker-type sunglasses can give the world a really pretty glow. Greens are greener, reds are redder, and yellows just tend to blend right away, which can be a real surprise when the vehicle in front of you puts on their yellow directional signal or the traffic light changes to yellow and you don't notice the change for an extra second because of eye glasses - Surprise! If you are wearing polarized glasses, they can give you a problem at certain angles seeing the LED gauges on your bike. There





A pair of 50 year-old eyes sees about rience (and are smarter and better looking) but we do see less. The 50 year-old eyes also have slower glare recovery and take longer to focus clearly when shifting from close-toto-distant-to-close again. As long as we are aware of our liabilities, we can adjust our driving patterns to them. Leaving a lot more following distance is one of the major solutions, and regular eye checkups are big-time important.

As sunlight turns to dark we put the sunglasses away or take off the dark face shield if we expect to see anything moving out there worth seeing. 
