


# Lobbyist's Legislative Report

## by James Lombardo, **Lobbyist & Assistant Legislative Director**

Governor Jerry Brown has vetoed the Senate and Assembly Democratcrafted 2012 state Budget, slamming the Republicans for failing to agree to an extension of the temporary sales tax and vehicle license fees until an election can be held in the fall, so the voters can decide once and for all how much they want to be taxed! The Republicans in both houses demanded Pension Reform for all public employees whether they work for the state, counties or cities. They also demanded relief from some of the many burdensome government regulations to help businesses out of the Great Recession, and a real cap on the state Budget and new state employee hires.

Reportedly, some Republican members were willing to agree to allow

the tax extension to be voted on by Californians later this year, figuring that Assemblyman Martin Garrick, a serious the voters would never agree to new or extended taxes! Stay tuned — more to come later on, in this session.



The Assembly passed our Motorcycle Awareness Month

Resolution in late May, authored by motorcycle rider, himself.

I also worked very hard the past few months, to have our Motorcycle Awareness amber alert signs up on the freeways, again this year. I am already working on this for *next* May. It takes ALL YEAR to get the MONEY and Caltrans to agree to display them on the electronic freeway billboards.

Our continued effort to **BLOCK**/ **STOP** Motorcycle **ONLY** Checkpoints is having some success. From my meeting with the Office of Traffic Safety, they are trying to ensure that any safety grant money that they give to local law enforcement agencies is to be used to crack down on both automobiles and motorcycles for failing Page 21 to yield the right of way, speeding and DUI enforcement, not just motorcycle riders.

# Knife Laws in

## by Sy Nazif, Esq

For my first Bailing Wiring column, I was asked to write about knife laws in California. After researching the law, I certainly understood why some confusion exists as to what is legal to carry and what isn't. There are over a dozen statutes on the subject, as well as numerous municipal codes, and inconsistent court decisions that further muddy the water. This article is intended to shed some light on the rules and inconsistencies in California knife laws.

Of course, I wouldn't be a very good attorney without giving a few caveats before I begin. First, remember that carrying any weapon, even one that's legal, can cause you a lot of grief with law enforcement. Cops routinely write tickets and make arrests for things they incorrectly think is illegal. Being found "not guilty" will not make up for the time and aggravation of getting arrested and missing work -- not to mention the cost of hiring an attorney. Also, this article only covers California law. State laws can vary greatly, and


## **Check it Out!** by John Del Santo

What a day! Let's buff up the bike and take a ride! Now, some people spend more time cleaning their bike than they do riding it, and others never clean it at all. One good thing about a good cleaning is that we find the nuts and screws that are getting loose before they fall out. If you don't want to clean your ride, at least slide your hands gently all along all the parts of your bike, touching everything as you go, to find anything that needs attention. Stroke it like it's your main squeeze - as a matter of fact, maybe it is!

How has your battery lasted over the winter? You may want to change it before the weather heats up. Hot weather kills a weak battery just as quick as cold weather. Tires are what keep us stuck to the road. Check the air pressure and tread depth. Check the valve stems and sidewalls for cracks. Many people change valve stems every time that they put on new tires. Being out in the open while we ride let's us hear a lot of things. Sometimes we hear a rattle or clunk that sounds like it's coming from our bike, and it's really from the car in the next lane. But if you still hear the sound a couple of blocks that group ride, don't stay near them. later, pull over and check it out before something falls off of your bike!



Are you packing some stuff for a day on the road? You don't want anything that will melt or explode in the saddle bag near the muffler or tailpipe. A chocolate bar won't stay solid for long, and a hot butane lighter can really make a powerful statement!



Now that the weather is starting to get nice, there will be people dragging their bikes out of the garage who haven't ridden since September. They may be rusty, they may not be concentrating, and they may screw up big time. If you don't know the person riding near you in



# "Falling Asleep" Has a Whole Different Meaning on a Motorcycle

A recent nationwide study showed that at least 100,000 collisions happen each year caused by people falling asleep while operating motor vehicles. I knew a man called 'Bear' who fell asleep three different times on motorcycle trips from Arizona to San Diego, so it can happen to us, too. After each incident he woke up out in the sand, lying near his bike. If you asked a large gathering of motorcyclists how many had "Dozed behind the

Handlebars", even for a few seconds or worse, you would be surprised at the large percentage of riders who have experienced that. There have been several newsworthy incidents about excellent long-distance highway riders, who just rode right straight into the back of big trucks, for no apparent reason.

Yawning is a sign from our body telling us that it needs more oxygen. This is usually not a problem on a bike, because we are getting plenty of air, so if you are yawning while riding, your body is telling you something important. One of the disadvantages while riding is that the excess wind, noise and vibrations can wear our body out sooner than when driving a car. If we recognize that fatigue sneaking up on us, then we are ahead of the game. If we are traveling in a group, remember that different riders have different abilities, habits and needs. If one of your group needs to stop, the whole group should stop.


Most falling-asleep accidents happen during daylight hours. People 18 - 20 years old have

the highest incidence of falling asleep behind the wheel, and commercial truck drivers have the least. Adequate rest, planning and preparing for your trip and consuming the right food and drink are considered ideal steps toward having a safe ride. Traveling during those hours of the day when you are normally asleep is asking for trouble. If you are drowsy, and figure that the wind will keep you awake on the ride home, then you will find that as bad an idea as the sleepy car drivers who think that rolling down the window will keep them awake.

Ways to recognize fatigue while riding? Inability to focus; yawning; loss of concentration; poor memory of the last few miles traveled. If your head nods ONCE or if you close your eyes and they feel sticky and don't want to open ONCE - get off the road RIGHT NOW. That may be the only warning that we will get before falling into deep sleep, maybe forever. Thinking that we are only a few miles from a good destination, and that we should be able to make it that far, would be a big mistake. Don't fool yourself with

stimulants. Using caffeine-based overthe-counter stimulants may get the brain awake, but when the buzz wears off, we will crash into sleep immediately with no warning.

What to do next? Pull over and take a nap. Many riders can sleep stretched-out on the tank of their bike, and there are many places like gas stations or convenience stores that will let you stretch out on one of their office chairs, if you explain the situation to them. When you wake up, have a cup of coffee, walk around some, have a high-protein snack, and see if you feel like going on. If you are really tired, grabbing a motel is always a possibility. There is nothing in the world that can't wait another day. You might just need a really convincing story for your significant other explaining why you stayed away overnight in a motel!
