Our very good friend and supporter, former Senator Denise Moreno Ducheny, is running for Congress in CD 51. This is a very clear choice she authored two Helmet Law repeal bills for ABATE, AB 1412 and SB 969 and co-authored every Helmet Law repeal bill introduced on behalf of ABATE, EVERY YEAR, no matter who carried it. She is running against Former Assemblyman and current Senator, Juan Vargas, who voted against our Helmet Law repealers when he was on the Assembly Transportation Committee and later when the bills came up on the Assembly floor for a vote - he is a former insurance industry executive! I will be reviewing this and other 2012 election races that ABATE needs to be involved in!

Please attend our next PAC meeting in Sacramento on October 15, or send a representative from your Local to get these important updates. We will be discussing our letter writing/petition drive at that PAC/Legislative Committee meeting as well.

PENNSYLVANIA MEASURE WOULD LIMIT LEARNER PERMITS: ABATE of Pennsylvania is supporting legislation to limit the number of motorcycle learner's permits allowed before a rider must get a license. "All too often those involved in serious accidents have no motorcycle endorsement on their license," lobbyist Charles Umbenhauer of BikePAC told the National Coalition of Motorcyclists (NCOM), adding that "In most cases this also means they have had no formal motorcycle rider training."

State Representative Seth Grove (R-Dover Township) has introduced legislation aimed at increasing motorcycle safety by requiring riders to get a motorcycle license rather than continuously reapplying for a motorcycle learner's permit.

Currently, an aspiring rider can get a permit after passing a written test, which is good for a year to allow motorcyclists to legally ride and gain experience until they get their motorcycle license. However, some riders reapply to renew the permit year after year rather than getting a full license, kind of disappointed with what the governor Rep. Grove said.

Under Grove's proposal, a rider would only be allowed to reapply for a learner's permit three tiate with the governor's office or try to override times in 10 years. FLORIDA COPS USE SECRET FILES ON BIKERS TO LOBBY AGAINST GUN LAW: Florida law-enforcement officials dipped into secret intelligence files to lobby against legislation that would have allowed holders of concealedweapons permits to carry their guns openly. Newly released records show that a staff lobbyist for the Orange County Sheriff's Office handed out restricted photos of bikers with valid concealed weapons permits to lawmakers as examples of the sort of people who might scare away tourists if they displayed their pistols.

"I actually stopped by every one of you guy's office this morning and dropped off ... photographs of some biker outlaw gang guys that have concealed firearm permits. Those are the ones we're worried about carrying," sheriff's Capt. Mike Fewless told the state Senate Judiciary Committee on April 12, 2011. "Please defeat this terrible bill."

firearms was removed from the bill, the state Senate voted against the measure, prompting accusations of fear-mongering by law-enforcement offi-

cials and raising concerns about police misuse of leging that the police are illegally profiling them, confidential files for political goals.

All together, Fewless obtained photographs and other information for 17 "outlaw bikers" from the Orange sheriff's Intelligence Squad, an undercover unit that investigates "motorcycle gangs, white supremacy groups and organized crime," specifically asking for pictures of "One Percenters", state attorney's records show. Seven of the For safety information or to enroll in the eight photos of members of the Mongols, Outclubs came originally from the state Driver and Vehicle Identification (DAVID) system, which Federal law classifies as "highly restricted personal information." None of the bikers had felony records and all were eligible for concealed-weapon permits recognized by Florida and 34 other states.

The motorcyclists are now represented by Aid to Injured Motorcyclists (A.I.M.) Attorney Jerry Theophilopoulos, who said he is planning to file a lawsuit against the sheriff's office. "The only way to police the police when they break the law is to file a lawsuit, and we are prepared to get justice for all concealed weapon permit holders in this state," according to "Jerry T", who serves as legal counsel for the Confederations of Clubs in Florida and advises ABATE of Florida on legal matters.

DRIVING WHILE BIKER: From the Gunny's Sack, a monthly newsletter from Oregon put the San Jose Police department on notice that

and the city's code enforcement unit is digging up zoning beefs to run them out of town. They say officers routinely pull them over, sometimes photographing their tattoos, based solely on their badboy reputations.

The Henchmen's complaint is not the first time a motorcycle club in San Jose has fought the law using the law. Five years ago, the Hells Angels won \$1.8 million after suing police and sheriff's deputies for illegally raiding the club's headquarters and members' homes to link a bouncer, charged with killing a drunken bar patron, to the biker club. A jury acquitted the bouncer and a federal court sided with the Hells Angels.

"This kind of thing has come to a halt in Washington with their recent biker anti-profiling law, thanks to the Washington Confederation of Clubs and A.I.M. Attorney Marty Fox," writes Gunny, "Fighting harassment by using a lawyer and the court system."

# Shake, Rattle and Roll

The emergency organizations tell us that in a severe emergency, fire, flood, earthquake, etc we should be prepared to be without water, electricity and other essential services for at least three days. Is there someone in your crew that has a need for a daily medication? They should have a threeday stash with them. It's also nice knowing that someone in your crew knows CPR and First Aid. If you don't have a sleeping bag that you normally tie to your bike, a few of those aluminum "space blankets" in your kit is good. # ABATE OF CALIFORNIA NEWSLETTER

"What you can't see won't hurt you". Anyone who believes that old saying never spent much time riding a motorcycle across the high desert! But you can be riding in any part of the country and run into treacherous winds and crosswinds can be meaner than a scorned lover. Actually, when you are going down the highway tipped over at a 45 degree angle, you already KNOW that conditions are dangerous, and you will be less likely to be surprised by another change in the airflow.

As you are moving up to pass a truck, ask yourself "is this pass necessary?" Then keep a healthy open space next to you. The crosswind will increase or decrease as you get next to the truck, (depending on whether you are upwind or downwind) and this may cause you to shift closer to the truck, be ready for that! Fall now and you're history. And when you finish your pass and come out the other end, be ready to get hit with the crosswind again. Wham!

Big vehicles create their own turbulence. A big bow-wake of air being pushed out in front of the vehicle, accelerated air flowing along the sides, that's the same stuff that creates lift on an airplane wing; hundreds of thousands of footpounds of force, punching a big fat hole in the air, creating a vacuum that rushes to fill itself in with buffeting, swirling air. And that's all in addition to any crosswind. Passing a big truck, bus or van in either direction creates about the same conditions as trying to drive your little outboard fishing boat close to a tugboat and barge out in the harbor. Beware, be aware, and be ready for any changes.



Dust storms in the farmland and sandstorms in the desert can create zero visibility in no time flat! If you decide to get off the road and sit it out, get far off the road and become invisible to avoid becoming a target for the next confused, half blinded driver coming down the road.

When the wind is not really radical, we still need to keep an open eye for sudden changes in the wind. Oklahoma, the Panhandle, coming up California 395 by Kramer Junction, heading towards Ridgecrest. Mountains and canyons or rolling hills, coming up on bridges and overpasses or out of tunnels we'll get some advance warning by watching for blowing dust or trees or grasses being bent over. Watch the vehicles running in front

of you, especially campers or vans or other bikes making sudden little shifts or wig-wags and corrections in their lanes. Watch for swinging signs by the highway pushed by gusts of wind, and dust devils swirling like mini-tornados coming across the fields towards you.

There is mixed opinion about whether or not solid rims will affect your lane control adversely in heavy winds, and if you happen to be using a windscreen for the first time, be ready for it to push you around a bit more with a 'sail' effect. Fighting the wind is a workout, we should be ready to take a break and sit it out for a while.

Even clothing can make a difference to the comfort of your ride. The more skin that you have showing, the more the wind will dry you out causing the need for more drinking water at your next stop.

The rim of a DOT half-helmet creates a hazard in heavy crosswinds; the wind will spend the whole day catching that rim, trying to rip your neck off! Better to choose another type of headgear. Clothing that is tighter gives the wind less to grab onto, therefore giving you a smoother ride, burning less of your energy, and leaving you in better shape at the end of the day.

So blow winds blow, but the prepared rider will be ready for you. You can huff and you can puff, but you're not gonna blow this rider down!
